FROM THE AMAZON TO THE ATLANTIC

Join ArtStart artists for a dynamic and fun-filled exploration of Brazil, one of the most diverse and spectacularly beautiful countries in South America. Designed for youth ages 4-12 years, Passport to Brazil immerses youth in the arts, culture, and ecology of this vast country—from the Amazon River basin to the beaches of Rio de Janeiro.

Youth ages 6-12 years select classes taught by professional artists from multiple arts disciplines—music, creative movement/dance, and visual arts. As a result of participating in this 5-day immersion experience, youth gain artistic knowledge and skills, learn about the people, geography and environment of a place and create art works and performances inspired by the culture.

Pre-school children ages 4-5 years register for "A Start with the Arts".

Youth ages 13 years and older register for "Camp CREATE", a studio-based camp with classes that parallel those offered for ages 4-12 years.

AT ONE WITH NATURE - MORNING CLASSES 8:30-11:45 AM

401 INSTRUMENT MAKING RAIN FOREST SOUNDSCAPE

The Amazonian basin is full of music made by birds, animals, and the sound of the tree canopy. Indigenous people have lived in Brazil for thousands of years in harmony with these sounds. Study some of the creatures that make this joyful noise, then work with an artist to make your own rainstick and flute using natural materials.



402 MASK MAKING SPIRITS OF THE RAINFOREST

The art of maskmaking, rooted in the traditions of indigenous people who live in the Amazon rainforest region, is fast becoming a lost art. Work with artists **Julie & Gustavo Boada** to create your own mask inspired by those of indigenous people who still maintain a deep connection to nature.

403 CLAY DREAMING OF AMAZONIA

From Bahia to Minas Gerais, Brazil has many beautiful pottery traditions. Learn all about the ancient forms and patterns used by early and contemporary artists in these regions. Then, working with artist **Lisa Himmelstrup**, dig your hands into some clay and create colorful bowls and shakers inspired by the Amazonian rainforest.

404 PUPPETRY JOURNEY SOUTH

Learn about the Fall journey south of Minnesota songbirds and the environmental challenges they face as they winter in the tropical rainforests. Join artist **Laurie Witzkowski** and create your favorite Brazilian birds using a variety of art media.



405 MIXED MEDIA RAINFOREJT ECOLOGY

Each day, learn something new about the incredible diversity of animals and plants that live in the rainforest. Then work with artist **Linda Jenson** to construct a diorama of a rainforest, complete with birds, animals, and the canopy!



A CHANGING LANDSCAPE - AFTERNOON CLASSES 12:30-3:45 PM

406 DANCE A MOVING EXPERIENCE

The Portuguese began to colonize Brazil in the 1500's. Join dancer **Christopher Yaeger** to learn dances that Portuguese arrivals might have danced in the 1500's from the royal court to country dances. Then go wild and create simple costumes and be a part of a Brazilian Carnaval experience.



407 PUPPETRY/STORYTELLING BUMBA-MOU-BOI

Bumba-Meu-Boi is a comical and very popular folk drama brought to Brazil by the Portuguese in the 1700's. The story is about the adventures of a prized bull. Join **Gustavo Boada** to create your own special puppet character for a Bumba-Meu-Boi performance.

408 ILLUSTRATION/STORYWRITING STORIOS ON A STRING

Often found hanging in Brazilian market stalls, stories on a string is based on the Portuguese literatura de cordel art form, which often featured exciting tales with illustrations, like "The Boy who Flew to the Moon," or "The Cat with Two Heads." Join artist **Tara Fahey** to make your own special little booklet, and create your own fantastic stories!

409 DRAWING AND PAINTING: AMAZING RAINFOREST OREATURES

Brazil is home to many different kinds of animals—everything from the three-toed sloth to the squirrel monkey to the poison dart frog! Artist **Karen Anderson** will help you learn a variety of drawing and painting techniques to create your rainforest masterpiece.



410 TEXTILES RAINFOROST INSPIRATIONS

Taking inspiration from the colorful flowers and insects of the Amazon rainforest, work with Julie Boada to learn two textile techniques: weaving using a backstrap loom, and stenciling with fabric paint. Then create beautiful pieces to decorate your room.

411 JEWELRY AMAZONIAN ADORNMENTS

Feathers and beads, gold and silver! Brazilian jewelry is recognizable for its colorful variety of textures. Learn about some cultures that inspire the art of adornment Brazilian-style. Then work with Rebekah Crisanta de Ybarra to create your own unique pieces to gift or wear.

501 INSTRUMENT MAKING GOURD-IOUS MUSIC

Work with an artist to create instruments from gourds! Learn about Afro-Brazilian contributions to the music played with Capoeira, the martial art form that is famous in that country. Then make instruments inspired by your learnings.



502 MOVEMENT MARTIAL ARTS MEETS DANCE

Originally Capoeira was developed by enslaved Africans in the Portuguese colonies of Brazil to defend themselves. Today Capoeira is an art form with elements of dance, music, and martial arts. Join Capoeira expert **Guerreiro** of Capoeira Minnesota, and learn the art of self-discipline and rules of engagement through this dynamic Afro-Brazilian tradition.



503 DRAWING & PAINTING POSTCARDS FROM BRAZIL

From vibrant rainforest landscapes to coastal seascapes to street scenes, life in Brazil is colorful and filled with a kind of indescribable energy. Work with an artist to look at modern Brazilian art work. Then learn basic color theory and create vibrant art works that capture the essence of Brazil.

504 MASK MAKING FACES OF THE RAINFOREST

Colorful masks and face painting from the indigenous Yanomami people of Brazil show the cultural memory and traditions of the tribe. Work with artist **Julie Boada** to learn about the Yanomami and how they live in harmony with the rainforest, then make a mask inspired by their art.



505 PUPPETRY

MAMULENGO THEATER

Mamulengo is a type of hilarious puppet performance popular in North East Brazil, especially in the state of Pernambuco. Papier-mâché hand puppets with funny characters interact with the audience, making up stories about ordinary life experiences. Learn all about this Brazilian theater form, then work with artist **Gustavo Boad**a to create your own puppet to entertain and engage your family and friends.

THE CARNIVAL CAPER - AFTERNOON CLASSES 12:30-3:45 PM

506 MUSIC

BRAZILIAN DRUMMING

The drum sets the beat for any Carnaval procession. Work with Batucada Do Norte's own **Tim O'Keefe** to learn the rhythms of the drum that lead the Carnaval celebration. Then perform on your own drum and other percussion to open our Carnaval celebration.



507 STILT-WALKING HIGH ABOVE THE OROWD

No parade is a parade without stilt-walkers! This ancient art, found in African culture, came to South America and is part of the Brazilian Carnaval procession. Learn how to balance and walk tall on stilts high above the crowd in the Carnaval parade with artists **Gustavo Boada** and **Angie Courchaine**.

508 MIXED MEDIA BRAZILIAN OARNAVAL OOSTUMOS

The Rio de Janeiro Carnaval in southeastern Brazil is an annual celebration held before Easter. People dress in colorful costumes and balance huge headpieces on their heads as they walk the streets playing music and dancing. Join artist **Julie Boada** and make a colorful, flamboyant headpiece out of reuse items, feathers, and more, plus a costume to wear in our Carnaval parade.

509 CONSTRUCTION ARTS OARNAVAL PARADO FLOAT

Work with artist **Tara Fahey** to create your own parade float in miniature for our Brazilian Carnaval celebration. Starting with a cardboard box, create a vehicle with moving wheels for your float. Add some paint, a bit of colored paper, and natural materials. Your float is ready to join the parade!



510 LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE DESIGN YOUR OWN ART PARK

Did you know that a garden could be a work of art? Brazilian artist Roberto Brule Marx was a master of creating outdoor arts experiences through flowers, foliage and sculptures. Learn all about his ingenious designs, which were created for music, laughter

and fun. Then work with artist **Laurie Witzkowski** to design your own
botanical space and create a
miniature version of it.

Paying it forward: Internship Program

One of the ways older ArtStart campers can turn their knowledge and skill learned in Camp CREATE into action, is to assist artists and staff as interns in ArtStart's 2-week Passport to Brazil camp for younger children ages 4-12 years. Interns work side-by- side with professional teaching artists to assist in the classroom.

The internship program is for youth ages 13 years & older. There are 16 openings for full-day internships this year. Interns receive a stipend each week. To be apply for an internship both new and returning interns should complete the following by April 26, 2024:

- Go to ArtStart's website and search for the application under the Camp Create tab. Fill out the online application for interns by April 26. You will receive notification regarding the internship within one week.
- 2. Register for Camp Create offered June 25-28, 2024 from 9 am-3 pm.
- 3. If you are selected, reserve Tuesday, July 2 from 10 am-3 pm for Internship Training and Camp set-up.

Angie Courchaine (they/them) is an acrobatic stilt walker who frequently performs and creates with Hijinks Stilts, Barebones Puppets, and In the Heart of the Beast. Angie is also a co-founder of Pinwheel Arts and Movement Studio and an Art Shanty Projects artist and producer.



Rebekah Crisanta de Ybarra

VISUAL ARTIST

Rebekah Crisanta de Ybarra (she/her, Maya-Lenca Nation) is an interdisciplinary and experimental artist, musician, and culture bearer whose work is rooted in Indigenous Futurisms and immersive storytelling such as "La Luz, la Galaxia, y la Sombrisa" (the light, the galaxy, and the sadness) and her puppet play for children "Star Girl Clan." A 2021-2022 Jerome Hill Artist Fellow, she is currently creating new music and instruments as Lady Xøk for the 2023 Cedar Cultural Commission entitled "Olonguayu toni mulauna" (I Still Have Medicine). Rebekah has performed locally and nationally and has over 20 years teaching Mesoamerican and Indigenous arts and crafts to people of all ages.



Sophia Crosby NATURALIST • MURALIST

Sophia received B.S. in conservation biology and environmental studies with a minor in art. Studied grouse, spotted owls, and pheasants as a field technician with the MN DNR and US Forest Service. As an artist, she created 3 educational wildlife and landscape murals for MN Valley NWR and the Eagle Lake Association. Sophia loves to sketch and paint nature while camping and backpacking.



Tara Fahey PUPPETRY • TEXTILES • PRINTMAKING

Tara Fahey is a multi-disciplinary artist, performer, and educator. Within their art, the layers of connection between the natural world, science, and spiritual relationship are interwoven. Since 2008, they created large dimensional puppets for Barebones outdoor night pageants, specializing in lanterns. In anchoring community printing workshops with Barebones for 15 years, Tara has learned and practiced silkscreen design and production. In 2019, with support from the Jerome Foundation Puppet Lab program at In the Heart of the Beast, Tara crafted a solo work, "Devotion: The Early Years of Rachel Carson," honoring the gifted scientist and writer. Their love of teaching is rooted in the joy of intergenerational sharing.





GuerreiroMARTIAL ARTS

Guerreiro began training in martial arts in 1996 and then began training Capoeira in October 2000 under the instruction of Rosa and Cravo. In 2013, Guerreiro began training with a former capoeira classmate and long time friend, Instructor Pulo, who ran Nova Luta Capoeira. Two years later, Guerreiro founded Capoeira Minnesota. In February of 2022, Guerreiro was promoted to the rank of Professor by the capoeira community of the USA. Today, Guerreiro teaches capoeira throughout the Twin Cities.



Lisa Himmelstrup

Lisa Himmelstrup is a teacher, art therapist, and clay artist with over 30 years experience in classroom and community settings. She currently teaches at the Northern Clay Center, and creates her own clay work in her home studio for shows and sales.




MIXED MEDIA
